

THOR-INSPIRED STORMBREAKER SUNDAE



INSTRUCT

INGREDIENTS

- Gray fondant
- Brown fondant
- ¼ cup crushed chocolate cookies
- 2 scoops vanilla ice cream
- 2 tbsp caramel sauce
- ½ golden apple, sliced
- 2 tbsp chocolate shell sauce
- Whipped cream
- 1 dark cherry
- Use the gray fondant to create the blade. Form the handle with the brown fondant, adding wood detailing with the back of a knife. Wrap the handle around the gray blade. Let dry or place in the freezer to set.
- Add the crushed cookies to the bottom of a bowl, saving a teaspoon for later. Top with one scoop of vanilla ice cream, and add the caramel sauce on top.
- Arrange the apple slices around the bowl.
- Top with the second scoop of ice cream, then pour over the chocolate shell sauce.
- Add a dollop of whipped cream, sprinkle the remaining cookie crumbs, and then add the cherry.
- Place the fondant Stormbreaker on top to serve.

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THOR-INSPIRED DIY CAPE & ARMOR



CAPE SUPPLIES

- Red fabric (recommended 60" wide and your desired cape length plus a few inches)
- Notions to attach armor and cape (suggestions include hook and looop, nylon straps, ribbon, or magnets)

CAPE INSTRUCTIONS

- With your pattern piece cut out, put it on the center fold of your fabric.
- Get a string or length of yarn and cut it to the desired length of your cape.
- Hold or pin one end of the string at the dot on the template at the neck band.
- Use a fabric marking pencil or similar at the other end of the string and trace an arc (sort of like a big compass).
- Extend the cape side line on the pattern until it meets your arc.
- Cut out your fabric and, for a nice finish, hem around the entire cape.
- Attach a ribbon, hook and loop, or your desired fasteners where the tabs are to attach your cape to the underside of your armor.

THOR-INSPIRED DIY CAPE & ARMOR



ARMOR SUPPLIES

- Foam (EVA foam, craft foam, or similar)
- Black t-shirt in your preferred size
- Contact cement
- Acrylic or fabric paint (optional depending on your materials)

ARMOR INSTRUCTIONS

- Cut out the badges and individual armor plates you want to use from the adhesive backed craft foam, duct tape, or fabric.
- Using your adhesive of choice, adhere your pieces to a black t-shirt.
- Depending on the color of materials you made your armor from, paint the armor details to match.



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*NOTE: Before beginning any work, you'll need to scale the template to the size you need. As currently sized, the template is fairly small (7" across the shoulders), so the easiest way to start is to measure from shoulder to shoulder and divide those inches by 7 to get the percentage you need to scale up. (For example, 200% makes the template roughly the same size as a Unisex small t-shirt.) Print out all your pages, taping together multi-page parts, and double check your shoulder measurement in case any final tweaks are necessary.
